DIET

Our puppies are Diamond Naturals large breed puppy formula, which is veterinarian recommended. Lamb is the first ingredient and has natural probiotics to aid digestion. We purchase 20-40 lb bags on Amazon.


If you are planning on transitioning your puppy to a different kibble we recommend a slow transition, mixing the new kibble daily with Diamond Naturals to reduce the risk of diarrhea or other digestive irritations.

We also recommend feeding and watering in stainless steel bowls as stainless steal is hygienic and can be cleaned safely with regular dish soap and warm water.






Vaccinations

Puppies will come to their homes with ALL vet-recommended vaccines. You should establish your new puppy at your local vet so they can receive new vaccines and regular care. Until puppies have all vaccines at 18 weeks they should not be allowed in communal doggie/animal areas, as they can contract diseases and have at-risk immune systems. Until puppies have all vaccines you should avoid dog parks, rest areas, pet stores, and parks. You can make a "safe area" for your new puppy to go outside by decontaminating the area. You can do this by using decontamination products or by spraying an area with a mixture of 1 gallon water and 1/2 cup bleach.



Hygiene

Bulldog Coats are easy to clean, however its wrinkles and other areas require more special care.

Your bulldogs nose and face wrinkles will require the most care, extending beyond puppy years. Depended on your puppy's wrinkles cleaning may be needed weekly or every day. You can use puppy-safe wipes to wipe any debris or "eye boogers", but make sure the area is dry by using a cotton pad or qtip. Below are recommended products we use.

<u>Nose Butter</u>: Reduces dry/cracked noses. We use after bathing or as needed. If your bulldog lives in a dry climate you can apply it more regularly.

<u>Deodorizing Shampoo</u>: This is what we personally use. You can dilute the mixture up to 24:1, or leave it more potent for more "stinky" situations.

<u>Wrinkle Paste</u>: We use this on our bulldogs after baths and after we dry out their wrinkles. This is especially helpful with bulldogs that have deeper wrinkles above their nose/face. This helps reduce irritation and odor. We recommend applying after drying out wrinkles with a cotton pad and letting them air-dry for about an hour.





Bringing a new puppy home is something that is fun and exciting for the entire family. However, it can be dampened by the loss of sleep that first night. Here is how to prepare for your first night home.

Decide where the puppy is sleeping:

In Bed: If you plan on sleeping in bed with your puppy than you may need to stay alert the first few days, as the puppy becomes acclimated to the new home and adjust to your family's sleep schedule. Never leave your puppy unattended in areas above 12-16 inches, including your bed.

Crate: If you are planning for your bulldog to sleep in a crate when it is older you should start the training ASAP. Move the crate to your room an make it comfortable. Remove toys from the crate at night, as you want your puppy to adjust to your schedule. Your puppy **will** cry. After being held and given attention that first day being put down may lead your puppy to pull every trick it knows. Try your best to ignore it, as giving it attention only reinforces that behavior. Partially covering the crate with a blanket may help, as your puppy cannot see what is going on around them or want to explore the new areas. Give your puppy anywhere from a few days to a week to adjust to crate training.

Digestion / Stomach

Again, bringing a new puppy home is filled with so much joy, for you and your puppy. We want to prepare you for the less glamorous things about puppy ownership. Your puppy may develop an upset stomach due to the big changes in its life. This is completely normal and usually resolves in 1-3 days as the puppy acclimates to its new home.

If your puppy develops diarrhea you can feed it 1-2 tablespoons of canned pumpkin (make sure it is NOT pumpkin pie filling). You can also give your puppy a bland diet if the diarrhea persist more than 24 hours, such as skinless boiled chicken and cookies white rice.

JAM'D Bulls also provides some samples of probiotics that helps with these symptoms.

Puppy Areas

To prepare for your puppy coming home we recommend preparing your house 1-2 weeks in advance. Puppies are naturally mischievous so you may want to prepare some puppy areas where they can be. Your puppy should never be left alone or unattended. To prepare a puppy area we recommend using some puppy gates to block off areas or connective pens to make an area for your puppy. The puppy area should be big enough for your puppy to run, play, and sleep in. Playpens should be sturdy, as your puppy may try to jump on the sides, and make sure openings are not large enough for their feed or head to fit through to avoid injuries.

Puppy areas should never have anything that is small enough that fits in the puppy's mouth or anything you don't want chewed on or played with.

Remember- this is the phase you want to teach the puppy routines and good habits.

The puppy area should have plenty of options of toys. We also recommend if you are crate or bed training than to put the crate or bed you are training them to sleep in nearby so that you can reinforce sleep-training during naps.

Puppies are still dogs, which are pack animals and do not do well alone for long periods of time. Make sure your puppy area is nearby or you are spending quality time with them regularly.

Puppy Areas

EvenFlo <u>Play pen</u>: This is what I personally use as it is sturdy, tall, adjustable, and the holes cannot fit any bulldog parts that could potentially get stuck.

<u>30 in dog bed</u>: This fits in standard sized crates and is also large enough for puppies to "grow into". This is also machine washable and dryer safe.

Toys

Puppies, especially bulldogs, can be heavy chewers. Avoid toys that can be easily broken or torn to avoid choking or your puppy ingesting pieces of plastic or other materials.


